Bus Rapid Transit (BRT): Four BRT lines will be developed to provide high-frequency service (every 10 minutes), making transit accessible to around 120,000 residents. The BRT system will be designed to reduce travel times and encourage walking, cycling, and public transport use, fostering more compact, walkable communities.

New Ferry Routes: Three new ferry routes will connect downtown Halifax with terminals in Mill Cove, Larry Uteck, and Shannon Park. These routes aim to reduce commuting times and provide an ecofriendly alternative to private vehicles, with ferries designed to be fast and environmentally efficient.

Sustainable Development: The strategy integrates transit with land-use planning, encouraging transit-oriented development near stations and terminals to accommodate population growth sustainably. This supports Halifax's broader environmental goals, aligning with the Integrated Mobility Plan (IMP) and the HalifACT 2050 initiative, which aims for a 75% reduction in emissions by 2030.
