About the Ecology Action Centre

Over 50 Years of Action

The EAC is Nova Scotia's oldest and largest environmental charity. Since 1971 we've been taking leadership on critical issues ranging from climate change, to biodiversity protection, to environmental justice.

Our work is broken up into seven areas:



Built Environment

Our Built Environment Team engages in urban planning issues across Halifax Regional Municipality and strives to be a voice for sustainable growth. We take action through plan and policy reviews, connecting community groups on development issues and creating opportunities to learn about urban planning.

Coastal & Water

Our Coastal & Water Team advocates for new and updated coastal regulations and policy. We promote a systems view of watersheds to fill legislative gaps, clarify jurisdictions, protect coastal environments from upstream activities and encourage nature-based solutions to coastal erosion and sea-level rise.



Energy & Climate

Our Energy & Climate Team seeks to phase out the use of fossil fuels in Nova Scotia and strives for an electricity system that is clean, reliable and affordable. We take action through analyzing and advocating for effective policy, research, piloting solutions, and building a coalition of diverse groups that share our vision for a just transition to zero-carbon energy in Nova Scotia.





Food

We all eat. But access to good food isn't equal for everyone. That's why the EAC's Food Team is working for positive change in Nova Scotia's food system. We collaborate with local government and advocate for a just and sustainable food system where the benefits and risks are equitably shared.

Marine

The EAC's Marine Team works locally, nationally and internationally for better fisheries management, strong ocean protections, traceable and transparent seafood supply chains and sustainable livelihoods. We work in communities and on the water, with advocacy informed by science and socio-economic expertise as well as Indigenous and local knowledge.



Transportation

Our Transportation Team works to increase equitable access to and use of transportation modes in Nova Scotia that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and promote healthy and safe communities. We advocate for improved active transportation infrastructure and supporting policy. We take action through capacity building, mentorship and resource development to support a sustainable transportation future.

Wilderness

Our Wilderness Team works to save the terrestrial biodiversity of Nova Scotia. Their advocacy focuses on three areas:

1. Protecting Core Areas as Anchors of Biodiversity,
2. Advocating for Healthy, Connected Working Landscapes,
3. Building a Culture of Nature Appreciation and Engagement.
